





Cattail Creek was a popular docking area for many customers who would walk up Robinson Landing Road to shop at Goska's. We're proud that we've remained a landmark in Severna Park and are celebrating our 91st year.

Q: What's your favorite summer drink?

A: The drink that screams summer for me would have to be a gin and tonic. English Dry Gin with quality tonic and plenty of lime is the perfect drink. You can't go wrong with Champagne or some icy Miller High Lifes, either.

Q: What's your favorite place on the Bay?

A: Not being a boater I would have to say the beach of Terrapin State Park in Stevensville after a storm to find some good sea glass. I also enjoyed sneaking onto Olde Severna Park's beach and bumping the shoreline for freshly sluffed soft crabs when I was young.

Q: Cecilia, would you share with us why you became a Realtor?

A: My passion has always been to find ways to fund charities in a consistent way.
