Junior Training Program

As a part of MRSA's promotion of excellence in sailing we are committed to the education and training of our junior sailors. The primary venue for MRSA sail training is a two-week camp focusing on both off water instruction and on water experience. Our location for the camp is The Grachur Club, located off Lake Shore Road in Pasadena, Maryland. Students will be taught using the approved USSA/CBYRA training program. MRSA uses prams, 420's and other small sailboats in this program.

Young sailors from 9 to 16 years old are invited to participate. No prior experience, other than swimming ability, is necessary. A mandatory swim test must be passed prior to any sailing. In the event the swim test is not given prior to the start of camp, it will be administered on the first day. This year the program will run from Monday-Friday, June 17th through June 28th, beginning at 0830 hours and finishing at 1600 each of these 10 days.

While the program is open to both members and non-members, preference is shown first to member families with children and grandchildren returning to the program, then MRSA/Grachur Club members with children new to the program, and finally non-members, with applications in each category evaluated in the order received. Established member families will be shown priority until April 20th, then new member families will be considered until May 15th, at which time all applicants will be considered with the same priority. An application appears in this **RED BOOK**. The application form will also be posted on the MRSA Web Page at <http://mrsa.sailnet.com>. In the past years, the junior training program has often filled quickly with member families, so early application is recommended for all categories.

Because MRSA is a VOLUNTEER club, we rely heavily on parents for assistance in boat maintenance, daily supervision, and the graduation picnic. You will be expected to participate in some way in each of these activities, and are asked to indicate your availability on the Junior Training application. With this support we are able to provide an outstanding educational and fun activity for our youth.

MRSA has established a member/caretaker program for our 420's. Members are allowed to take a 420 or pram of their choice home with them. The intent is for the students to have more sailing opportunities and to improve the condition of the boats. Hopefully, these boats will be returned in better condition than when they were taken. Please note on the application form if you are willing to bring a boat home with you and maintain it.

We also hope to participate in other local Laser and 420 events on the river depending on interest, and will publicize these events in *The Old Man*. Junior Training is a key part of the MRSA mission and we look forward to another successful year in 2002. 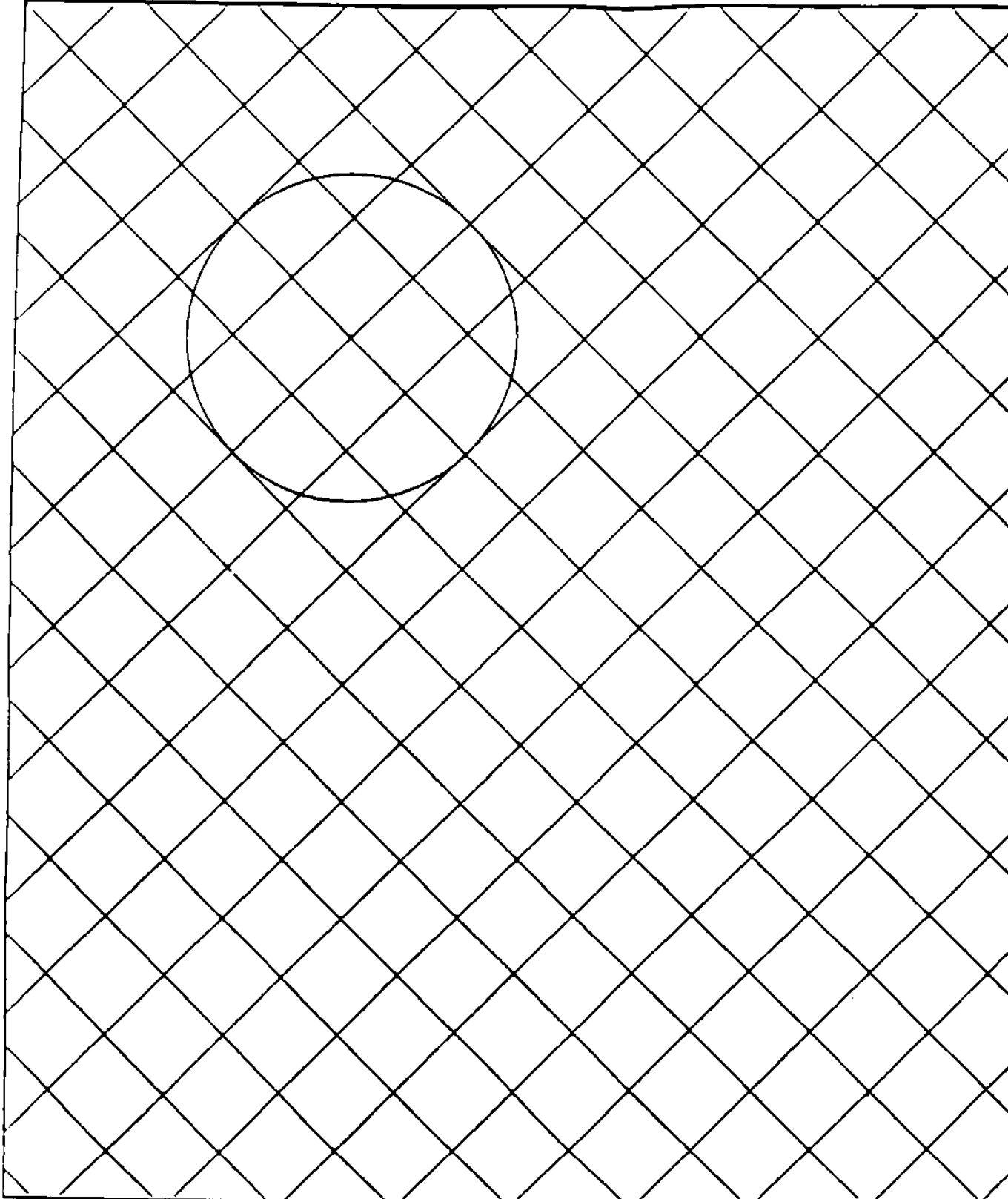

Time Limit

The time limit is 2.5 hours. Boats not finishing within the time limit will be scored in accordance with the General Sailing Instructions.

Scoring

Scoring shall be by the series scoring method in the General Sailing Instructions with the following exceptions:

If four or more races are sailed in the series, the boat's highest score will be dropped in computing the score for the series. However, a score of DSQ may never be dropped.

If a boat performs Race Committee duty for one race of the series, her score for that race shall be the average of her scores for the remaining races in that series. Her highest score will then be dropped (if there are at least 4 races in the series) to compute the series score. A boat may only do Race Committee duty for one race of a series and still be qualified for that series.

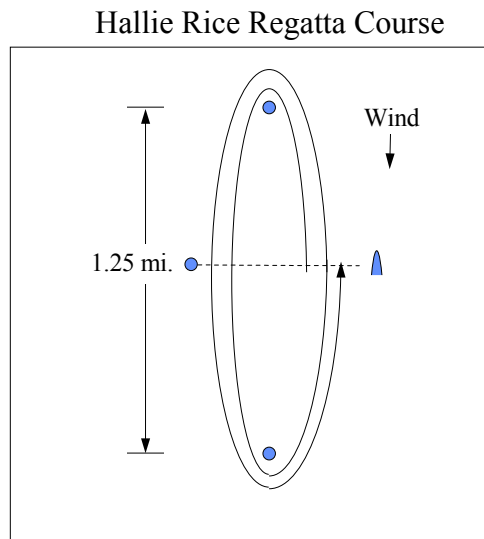

Courses

The course will be a windward/leeward course as shown below and will be a total of 5 nautical miles in length. Note that the course consists of two laps and turning marks are to be left to port. The marks defining the starting line are not marks of the course except when starting or finishing.



Marks

The marks may all be temporary drop marks or at its discretion, RC may incorporate one Magothy River special racing mark to facilitate course designation

The Start

The Hallie Rice Regatta is handicapped at the start of the race instead of the finish. This means that each boat starts at a different time depending on her rating. A listing of all entrants along with their respective delay times will be published in *The Old Man* and on the MRSA Web Page (<http://mrsa.sailnet.com>). Each boat shall start at her given delay time after the starting signal.

Scoring

Sportsmanship

Time Limit

2 hours per race. Yachts not finishing within the time limit will be scored in accordance with the General Sailing Instructions.

Scoring

Scoring shall be by the series scoring method in the General Sailing Instructions with the following exceptions:

If four to six races are sailed in the series, the boat's highest score will be dropped in computing the score for the series. If seven or more races are sailed in the series, the boat's highest two scores will be dropped in computing the score for the series. However a score of DSQ may never be dropped.

If a boat performs Race Committee duty, her score for those races shall be the average of her scores for the remaining races in that series, her highest score will then be dropped (if there are at least 4 races in the series) to compute the series score. A boat may do Race
