Racing Corner

Eleven boats registered for this year's Spring Fling representing 6 different clubs. The day of the race brought some challenging conditions with very light winds. The light, sporadic breezes may have favored one starting location over another as the top 3 boats (2 monohulls and 1 MH) started and finished at the southernmost starting line. Ed Tracey and Tim Polk's *Incommunicado* won the CRCA racer/cruiser division and Jeff Thompson on *PATRIOT* won the multihull division. Even with the conditions there was a lot of good feedback and suggestions including picking directions as well as starting marks next year. Could lead to some exciting mark roundings.



On the MRSA Wednesday night racecourse, we had our first pursuit race of the season on 5/10. The front that caused cancellation of the AYC, nipped the Magothey bringing spicy conditions with reports of 25+ knots true heading up to windward mark. *Windswept* was in her element looking great heeling smartly with her huge genny. The wind dying to 6 at the finish was not so great for the late starters. *UltraViolet* won line honors with *Incommunicado* 24 seconds behind holding off *Charlie*

with *Sagacious* and *Windswept* coming in close on their heels. *Allu* sailed a great race and won the non-Spin class.

With 23 races and currently 16 boats registered, we hope that the "Pursuit and Race" option will help to fill in the holes.

Our frostbite racing, AKA MRSA Series 1, came to a close on the 17th. *Endless Summer* rode their three bullets to take a close win over *Allu* in the non-Spin class. The Spin class was really close with *UltraViolet* taking a 1 point lead over *Incommunicado* and *Sagacious* using her 2 bullets to nose *Charlie* for 3rd place. *Mikayla* in the Multihull class was mostly about staying ahead of *UV* and *Charlie* and are looking forward to getting more boats on the line for series 2. The PSA Moonlight race, one of the best races of the season and definitely the best breakfast on the Bay, is coming up on June 17th.
