MRSA September Long Cruise 2024

This year the cruising group of MRSA decided to do a one-week cruise starting Labor Day weekend. Rather than doing long days, we also decided to explore the Choptank River. For once, the weather was great with warm days and cool nights.

On Saturday, August 31st, Mike and Loura Bonham on *Frequent Flyer*, Debbie and John Lund on *Chapter Three*, Joyce and Ziya Gun on *Island Time* and David and Shari Argue on *Mariah* gathered in Galesville,

West River. Former members, Rod Swank and Dennise Fath on *Moxie*, joined us for happy hour.

The Choptank River exploring started on Sunday by going to San Domingo Creek off Broad Creek. This creek is better known as the back door to St. Michaels. It is less crowded than the Miles River side of St. Michaels. Two boats ventured in Knapps Narrows and two boats went around Tilghman Point. *Chapter Three* even flew a spinnaker (only 5 knots of wind). Stu and Vicky Timerman on *Dark Star* and Larry Turner and Angela Cremeans on *Coquille* joined the cruise. A cold front came through during the night which gave us northerly winds for several days.
