This year, our Sock Burning Party will be on **Saturday, May 3 from 4:00 – 7:00 pm**. We are switching locations to the **Twin Harbors Marina Pavilion** at the end of Baybourne Drive in Arnold. I have put in an order for good weather (and there is a spacious covered area for anyone shunning the sun). Best of all, our own Larry Turner (aka, The Six String Sailor) will be treating us to his excellent musical talents. So, mark your calendars to join us for the food, drinks and merriment.

If you come by sea, there is good anchorage on Dividing Creek, but be sure to respect the red buoy as you enter. A number of benches and tables are available for sitting, but it might be a good idea to toss a folding chair into your trunk in case you need it.
